Intermediate boundary marker Southeast #2 is situated in the front yard of 4345 Southern Avenue. It is located approximately 45 feet southeast of the centerline of Southern Avenue and 50 feet southwest of centerline of R Street, S.E. The sandstone marker is in good condition. A 3' x 3' x 5' iron fence, also in good condition, surrounds the marker.
