

Intermediate boundary marker Northwest #7 is located at 5600 Western Avenue, approximately 60 feet from the centerline of the Avenue. The sandstone marker is in good condition, but its fence has been removed.

An expanded statement of significance is given in the Boundary Markers of the Original District of Columbia Multiple Documentation Form.

Northwest #7 boundary stone was the fourth marker to be located in Maryland. It was laid in 1792. It is located in the front yard of the residence. Its fence was dedicated on October 14, 1915 by the Patriot's Memorial Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution; it is not known when the fence was removed. The stone is now under the stewardship of the Eugenia Washington Chapter.

Verbal Boundary Description:

The stone is located in the front yard of 5600 Western Avenue approximately 60 feet from the center line of Western Avenue (District of Columbia) and 50 feet from the centerline of Cedar Parkway (Maryland).

Boundary Justification:

The boundary stone has historically been situated at this point and maintains historic integrity.
