Built by Jess Pierman in 1912, the Madison Hotel is the only remaining early hotel in West Yellowstone. The building has retained a high degree of architectural integrity. Although not the first and certainly not the only hotel in West Yellowstone, the Madison in now the only hotel remaining which dates back to the period when West Yellowstone was an entrepreneur's dream during the summer tourist months. Very few businesses in West Yellowstone have been able to weather the economic changes and physical changes which have drastically affected the community's tourist industry and for this reason, the Madison is of singular importance.

Prior to the establishment of the Union Pacific RR's domitory facilities in 1925-6, summer tourists and railroad employees relied primarily upon local entrepreurs to provide lodging. The Madison Hotel represents an early response to this need.
