

A detailed description of the physical characteristics of the stone is given in the Boundary Markers of the Original District of Columbia Multiple Documentation Form.

Intermediate boundary marker Northeast #4 is located in the back yard of the residence at 5400 Sargent Road. It is located approximately 175 feet northwest from the centerline of Sargent and 45 feet northeast of the centerline of Eastern Avenue. The sandstone marker is in good condition. A 3' x 3' x 5' iron fence, also in good condition, surrounds the marker.

An expanded statement of significance is given in the Boundary Markers of the Original District of Columbia Multiple Documentation Form.

Northeast boundary stone #4 was the eleventh marker to be located in Maryland. It was laid in 1792. Its fence was dedicated by the Elizabeth Jackson Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution on November 18, 1916.

Verbal Boundary Description:

The stone is located approximately 45 feet northeast of the centerline of Eastern Avenue and 175 feet northwest from the centerline of Sargent Road. The fence surrounds the stone.

Boundary Justification:

The boundary stone and fence have historically been situated at this location and maintain historic integrity.
