SIGNIFICANCE

20b Please justify the historical significance; noting important persons, events and/or historical patterns associated with structure, site and surrounding area.

The Pine Butte School, like the Lower Bridger School and Pass Creek School, is representative of the gable ended, frame schoolhouse type with a band of windows on one side only (E). The building is characterized by the addition of an entry vestibule to provide protection from the harsh environment. The relocation of the windows was influenced by a bulletin published by R.W. Plew in 1919. This publication recommended that the windows be placed on only one wall to prevent cross lighting which was reputed to cause eye discomfort.
