ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Golden West Cemetery is situated on a rolling hill rising to the west along the outskirts of Port Gibson. The eastern border of the cemetery is on the city's western boundary. Measuring approximately three acres, the cemetery is largely overgrown, unkempt, and inaccessible. An entranceway from Rodney Road runs north along the eastern flank of the property. Carved stone monuments used during the early part of this century have been succeeded by cast-concrete slabs with hand-etched insciptions. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: The Golden West Cemetery property was appropriated to local blacks for use as a burying ground around the turn of the century. Known locally as Port Gibson Negro Cemetery until the 1970s, the property was renamed by Agnes Quigless of the Golden West Cemetery Association. After 1970 a second black cemetery was established in a lot east of Golden West, and named Scott Memorial Cemetery. Though lacking sign- ificant landscape features, Golden West displays an evocative rural quality and a primitive expression of folk art in its makeshift monuments.	PHOTOS
