7. Description:

The Westside District encompasses an area of approximately thirteen blocks, adjacent to the commercial core, to the southwest (Maps C & D). In this segment of Livingston's original plat, resided the city's wealthiest and most prominent citizens, as well as those of more modest means. Major streets in the District are Yellowstone, a wide artery connected to Livingston Island by a bridge across the Lagoon; 5th Street, the only westside street which now crosses the tracks; and 6th Street. To the northwest, the District boundary abuts the alley behind Park Street properties, the edge of the Commercial District (District 2). On the southeast it extends toward the river. Boundaries of the District, while not distinct with absolute clarity, were fixed so that they would encompass the highest concentration of buildings rated primary and secondary.

The District contains a mixture of moderately large and smaller houses, along with two schools and four churches. With the exception of steeples and the additions to the Middle School, no building rises above two-stories. on a tree-lined street. Alleys provide further open space, as well as giving access to garages and even a few carriage houses. Although larger two-story houses are mixed with smaller ones throughout the District, a cluster of more ostentatious houses from c. 1900-1910 occurs on S. Yellowstone between W. Callender and W. Clark Streets. Three of the churches are located on W. Lewis between S. 3rd and S. 5th near the two school buildings at S. 5th and W. Callender, giving this part of the neighborhood a more public character.

Most of the houses in the Westside District date from after They are generally compact, rectangular, and symmetrical. 1900. Many have generous porches, often enclosed. While a number of the houses are quite simply detailed and massed, some of the larger ones make references to nationally popular styles of the 1880-1920s era. The Harvat House at 229 S. Yellowstone (c. 1896-1907) (Photo #18) is a two-story sand-colored brick Queen Anne style building with a prominent octagonal corner tower. 402 S. 5th (Photo #10) is a Shingle Style house, c. 1910. The Talcott House (1903) at 206 S. Yellowstone (Photo #16) is an imposing colonial revival house on a large lot, with an iron fence. One of the few Prairie style houses in town is at 220 S. Yellowstone (c. 1920) (Photo #17). These are all constructed of brick and wood and have stone foundations. Five houses in the District are constructed almost entirely of stone, including those at 122 S. Yellowstone (c. 1900)(Photo #14) and the Garnier House at 313 S. Yellowstone (1904)(Photo #20), both of which have simple classical details. Houses of a latter date are mostly bungalows, for example, 104 S. 5th, 116-118 S. 6th, and 516 W. Callender (Photos #8, #3, #5). These are generally wood frame buildings covered with stucco or clapboard, although some have brick bases.

The four churches of the district are all Gothic revival of a sort. Dates range from c. 1884 (St. Mary's Catholic Church, now Livingston Congregational at 226 S. 3rd)(Photo #21) to 1933 (Holbrook Methodist Church, by architect Fred Willson, Bozeman). These churches form an integral part of the District and could not have been excluded from it without jogging boundaries. Westside school (1895), now abandoned is brick "Romanesque" (Photo #6), while the County High School (1904) has been encased in concrete additions (1917, 1939, Fred Willson) and now serves as the Middle School.

8. Significance:

The Westside District contains the most architecturally significant residences and churches in Livingston, in terms of both design quality and integrity. Many of these structures were the homes of important figures in the city's early history: merchants, bankers, doctors, lawyers, and city officials who chose to reside in proximity to their places of work downtown, just as workers located near the railroad shops. In the 1880s and 1890s, they lived on 2nd and 3rd. But with the economic boom after 1900, increased wealth and expansion of the commercial district encouraged construction of large new homes further west along Yellowstone, which because of its bredth must always have been intended to be a fashionable street. Churches and schools existed here as early as 1884. The Catholics, Episcopalians, and Congregationalists built here, while on the eastside were the Norwegian Lutherans, Baptists, and Methodist-Episcopalians. Both east and westsides probably had masonry elementary school buildings by the mid-1890s. but Livingston High School, organized about the same date, began instruction upstairs in the Westside School. By 1904, the County High School opened its doors across W. Callender. Ranchers, such a J. H. Harvat (whose 1914 ranch house is nominated as an individual property) moved to town so that their children could attend. The Harvats lived on S. Yellowstone in the blocks between Callender and Clark, named as "Bankers' Row," after their neighbors, E. H. Talcott and J. C. Vilas, both of whom were National Park Bank Presidents.

The Westside District has continued to be a desireable neighborhood since the turn-of-the-century. Both the small onestory and larger houses are generally well maintained and owner occupied. Houses constructed since the 1920s tend to be more modest than the earlier ones, but are complementary in scale, massing, and materials. The inevitable re-siding, stuccoing over, replacing of windows, and remodeling of porches have taken place, but not irredeemably or intrusively in most cases. Commercial uses have made some incursions along 3rd and Park Streets, which are zoned commercial, but not to a great extent. The Westside District has maintained its character as a pleasant early 20th century residential neighborhood, except that the trees are bigger now. FHR-8-300A (11/78)
