DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Steuben County Jail was the brick and concrete inspiration of Ohio architects Gibbs and Moser. Built in 1877, the 2 1/2 story structure has an irregular main wing with a rectangular prison wing extending from the back of the building. Light rust colored and black brick were used in between concrete coursing. A sculpted representation of a sun with the completion date inscribed, adorns the entrance The roofs of the back wing and two recent additions (the enclosure of a north porch in 1961 and a large though unobtrusive south wing in 1971) are flat while the main structure has a slate mansard roof. The main wing also contains an elaborate tower with a pyramidal roof and an elaborate cupola and weathervane on top. There are four brick chimneys at each corner of the main wing. The hooded dormer windows are sculpted in the Second Empire mode. Elaborate brickwork forms the cornices. The windows are double hung with a flush fan and concrete quoining surrounding them. A Victorian style grill work covers the front entrance stoop which leads to the simple door with a segmented architrave. The interior has handsome wood mouldings in the sheriff's quarters while the jail is plain yet very functional and comfortable.

Aside from the two additions mentioned which marr but do not obstruct the unity of the original structure, the jail has changed very little. It continues to serve as an effective penal institution with an architectural charm not widely seen in buildings of this use.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

September 6, 1876 proposals for a new county jail were discussed by the Steuben County Board. A few months later, Gibbs and Moser, Ohio architects, had been selected to design the structure which was to include the jail, residence for the County sheriff and the sheriff's offices. The construction firm of Litzenberger and Zoller of Fort Wayne finished the building on schedule in 1877 for the sum of \$21,144.13.

Much architectural interest is derived from the anomalous nature of the structure, (This is with out reference to the two functional additions; in 1961 a north porch was enclosed, and in 1971 an addition was made on the south side.) Gibbs and Moser employed pale rust brick, and white painted wood for trimmings, in a manner that defies architectural classification. The tower, cupola and weathervane are truly a delight.

From a historical perspective, the Steuben County Jail was designed with a humane touch not typical of penal institutions in the 1870's. The cells have not been changed up to this very day and local authorities report, they serve their purpose with rarely a complaint.

The adverse effects of a monotonous poorly planned jail have only recently become a public concern. It is for this reason that far sighted humane planning coupled with an attractive well constructed design gives the Steuben County Jail great significance.

It has also become a significant landmark in the community of Angola and serves with the courthouse as a focal point in the downtown area.
