DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The present Plaza Ferdinand VII is a remnant of the original city square laid out by the British in 1765, a large part of which was subdivided and sold as building lots in 1802. It has always been a city park, and has been replanted and renovated in the past decade, as part of general restoration and improvement activity in this oldest section of downtown Pensacola. The plaza is located in the midst of the old civic and commercial center, parts of which are listed as historic districts on the National Register.

While original descriptions of the park have not been located, it is known that the area has always been a city park. In the recent improvement project a new fountain was designed and benches were installed along the walks. At this time, the nineteenth century fountain was removed, but because of public outcry at this "modernization," the old cast-iron fountain was replaced, in the new basin.

Within the park also is a stone obelisk monument and at the northwest corner there are four plexiglass bus-stop shelters. The park is now landscaped and well-maintained, a considerable improvement over its condition a decade ago. Shrubs and flowers are planted amid an abundance of mature native trees. A low stone wall surrounds the park and old cannon are mounted at the four corners.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In this square, on July 17, 1821, the transfer of Florida from the rule of Spain to that of the United States was formally completed. As a result of the Adams-Onis Treaty of July 22, 1819, Spain agreed to cede East and West Florida to the United States in exchange for American assumption of claims against the Spanish Government amounting to five million dollars. After two years delay, Spain finally ratified the treaty on February 22, 1821.

On March 12, Andrew Jackson received a commission as governor of both Spanish provinces, which were to be combined into one territory. Jackson appointed Col. Robert Butler as his deputy to accept the transfer of East Florida, while he proceeded to Pensacola to accept that of the other province. Both Jackson and Butler encountered delaying tactics on the part of the Spanish governors, but the transfer of East Florida was accomplished first, on July 10. Another transfer ceremony occurred at Fort St. Marks early in July.

The third and final transfer ceremony occurred here on the morning of July 17. At 10 a.m., Jackson rode to the steps of Government House (on the site of the present City Hall), met the Spanish Governor Callava, and with him descended the steps and entered the plaza. Passing between lines of United States and Spanish troops, they stood at attention. While the Fourth Infantry band played "The Star-Spangled Banner," the Spanish royal standard was lowered to half-staff, and the American flag was raised to a level with it. Then, as the <u>USS Hornet</u> in Pensacola Bay began firing a 21-gun salute, the Spanish flag was lowered and the Stars and Stripes raised to full staff. With completion of this ceremony, Jackson officially proclaimed the establishment of Florida Territory, and four days later he set up a territorial government, with the temporary seat at Pensacola. Of the three transfer ceremonies, this one at Pensacola was the most significant, because it was the only one in which the territorial governor participated, and because it was followed immediately by the official proclamation of transfer and the establishment of the territorial government.
