

19. Fort Leavenworth, Kans., then and now. Built in the late 20. 1870's, this building at Kearny Ave. and McPherson was originally designed as post headquarters, but was used from 1881 to 1890 as the Cavalry and Infantry School of Application. It now houses the Army National Bank and administrative offices of the Nike Battalion. U. S. Army photographs.

"The Rookery", Bldg. # 19. Built ca. 1834. Oldest building still extant at Fort Leavenworth. The first governor of Kansas, Andrew Reeder, lived in this building in 1854.



Known informally as the "Syracuse Houses", Buildings 20 & 21 are unique among military construction, built to house married officers and their families. Designed and built ca. 1855 by an architect from Syracuse, New York



First Officers' School at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. This building, opened in 1881, housed the Command and General Staff College of the U. S. Army. The Post Finance Office and the Army National Bank are currently located in this building.
