DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

STYLE: Greek Revival

PLAN: Basically "L" shaped with three main buildings connected by overhead walls affording entry into a court.

MATERIALS AND METHOD OF CONSTRUCTION: Brick with stucco struck like stone. Wooden roof trusses and carved wooded brackets. Cast iron columns in courtyard. Wood cornice and slate roof. Cypress wood cupola. Brick Chimneys. Brick relieving arches over doors. Stone arches and quoins.

EXTERIOR APPEARANCE: West (front) elevation virtually symmetrical. Doric pilasters and deep cut gables. Twin gabled structure in the center connected to smaller outer buildings by crenelated wing walls. South elevation symmetrical and broken by numerous windows and doors. Courtyard elevations similar but lack unity.

SCALE AND PROPORTIONS: Scale is somewhat clumsy and the mass is disturbed by extensive articulation; especially deep overhangs in the gables.

INTERIOR APPEARANCE: Wood floors and details with high ceilings. Plain wooden stairs. Plaster walls.

IRONWORK: Extensive and exceptionally fine wrought iron work in gates, semi-circular windows, and miscellaneous fittings.

Front, or west elevation virtually unchanged.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Thomas James, architect

In the early 1800's there was a open municipal market in the general area of the present City Hall. Between 1823 and 1842 it was located on this same site. Farmers and gamessellers displayed their wares, and live fish were sold from cypress tanks.

In 1842 the Alabama Supreme Court ordered the open markets removed. It was not until ten years later, 1852, that the order was obeyed and then only after a complaint was filed in chancery court. Bonds were issued to finance the new building.

The building was completed in 1858 during the term of Mayor Jones M. Withers.

1852-1858

It continued to serve as a market place and was also used as a militia armory during the civil war. Reserve troops drilled in the court yard.

After the Civil War several municipal offices moved into the upper floors of the building. Part of the structure continued to serve as an armory, and shop owners began to move into the lower parts of the building. A few shops were still vending their miscellaneous wares from the structure in 1940.

Gradually the entire building was occupied by municipal offices. Today it is the center of municipal government, housing the offices of the three city commissioners and the majority of the departments of city government.
