DISCOVERY CLAIM

"DISCOVERY CLAIM". ABOUT 1-2 MILE NORTHERLY ON ANVIL CREEK. WAS LOCATED ON SEPTEMBER 22, 1898 BY JAFET LINDBERG, JOHN BRYNTESON AND ERIC LINDBLOM. BRYNTESON, A COAL AND IRON MINER FROM MICHIGAN, AND OTHERS HAD MADE A PROSPECTING TRIP TO THE SINUK RIVER FROM GOLOVIN THE PREVIOUS SUMMER AND WHILE ENROUTE HAD TO LAY OUT A STORM IN THE SINUK RIVER. NOME. DURING THIS LAYOVER SOME COLORS WERE FOUND ON THE BEACH. HOWEVER, IT WAS NOT CARRIED FURTHER. BRYNTESON INTERESTED LINDBERG, A FORMER OVERSEER OF LAPP REINDEER HERDERS, AND LINDBLOM, A TAILOR WHO HAD BEEN SHANGHAIED OUT OF SAN FRANCISCO ON A TANKER AND WHO HAD JUMPED SHIP AT PORT CLARENCE, IN PROSPECTING THE AREA WHICH LEAD TO THE DISCOVERY. ABOUT \$1,800 WAS RECOVERED FROM THE CLAIM DURING THE FALL OF 1898. THE FIRST GOLD TO BE MINED IN THE NOME DISTRICT. THE "DISCOVERY" WAS LATER KNOWN AS THE "MILLION DOLLAR A MONTH MINE" AND THE MEN INVOLVED IN THIS DISCOVERY WERE KNOWN AS THE "THREE LUCKY SWEDES". BY OTHER LESS FORTUNATE PROSPECTORS WHO CAME LATER.
