In 1905 Tiffany's moved into their new store on Fifth Avenue at 37th Street. Their architects, McKim, Mead and White, had copied "a building without fault," the Palazzo Grimani, erected in the sixteenth century on the Grand Canal in Venice.

It cost over \$600,000 to build and the land it was built on had been purchased for the highest price paid for a site in the history of the city -- \$2,000,000.

Tiffany's remained at this location (which is still standing) until 1940 when they built the present store at Fifth Avenue and 57th Street.
