DESCRIPTION

The United Brethren in Christ Church, built in 1880, is located in Milltown, South Dakota. Milltown is in north central Hutchinson County which is located in the southeastern part of the state. The church is a few blocks west of the James River and is surrounded by trees on the north and west sides. The church sets on a gently sloping hill which begins at the entrance road and slopes to the crest of the hill to the west of the church. A driveway circles the church for entering and exiting. The gabled rectangular church has a cement foundation (which replaced the original foundation in 1945) wood clapboard siding and an asphalt shingled roof. In the late 1980's a small central bell tower on the south end of the roof was removed due to structural problems. Because the bell tower wasn't as prominent as on some churches, the removal of the tower was a minimal architectural alteration and did not compromise the historical integrity of the old church.

There is a semi-circular four stepped concrete staircase leading to the gabled entrance on the south elevation of the church. Metal handrails are attached to the church on either side of the front doors. The entrance has two over two double hung windows on both the east and west sides of the gabled entryway. There are also two basement windows on either side of the entrance on the façade. A fixed, small, round window is located near the top of the main gable on the façade.

From left to right on the east elevation there are four two over two double hung windows on the main floor. On the foundation level from left to right there is a single pane window, an outside entry into the basement with concrete steps, wood siding and a metal roof and another single pane foundation window near the north end. The outside entry was built in 1945 at the same time that a new basement and foundation was constructed.

The north elevation has only two window openings and they are located on the foundation level and are single paned. A centered chimney rises from the foundation to a few feet above the roof line.

From left to right on the west elevation there are four two over two double hung windows on the main floor and four single pane foundation windows.

The interior of the church has an entryway with a stairway on the west side to the basement. Double doors separate the entrance from the nave. The rectangular nave has wooden floors with a center aisle and wooden pews on either side. The one step elevated altar area retains its original configuration. The basement has a meeting hall and a kitchen to accommodate church activities.

SIGNIFICANCE

The United Brethren in Christ Church is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C as it represents the distinctive characteristics of the small rural churches that were constructed in South Dakota during the late 19th century and early 20th century. The church also meets Criteria Consideration A for religious properties as it is primarily significant for its architecture. "The buildings associated with the religious history and ethnic heritage of South Dakota are significant physical expressions of the people who built them and the period in which they were constructed. In terms of architectural evolution, churches represent a synthesis of cultural and religious traditions manifested in a building that served as a spiritual and social center for communities over a long period of time."

There were two plans followed by congregations when constructing their church. The first was the ritual, or liturgical plan. This plan features a central altar and the nave, apse, chancel, and transepts (if present) are apparent from the exterior. The second plan was the non-ritual, denominational plan. In this plan the pulpit receives more emphasis than the altar. Interior organization is also less evident from the exterior in this plan. The most common church design in South Dakota was nave plan, the simplest of the ritual plan versions. Churches built according to this plan are rectangular with a nave, a narthex beneath a central front bell tower, and generally lack transepts.² Most of these simple nave-plan churches have been identified as vernacular adaptations of the Gothic Revival style because while they do have lancet arches on windows and doors, they generally have little or no other forms of decoration.³ The United Brethren in Christ Church in Milltown, South Dakota is representative of the simple nave plan architecture.

Hutchinson County was created in 1862 from the Dakota Territory. The county was officially organized in 1871 and was named after John S. Hutchinson. Hutchinson was the first Secretary of Dakota Territory and acting Governor during much of the period of William Jayne (1861-1863).

In 1873, Daniel Shearer's family was the first to settle and start the town called Milltown. Shearer's home served as the first store, hotel and post office.⁵ Daniel Shearer was given credit for building the first dam on the James River and then building the mill with M.T. Wooley a few years later.⁶

In 1888 the Mennonite Colony bought the mill and ran it for 32 years grinding for people in a large area around Milltown. The mill was eventually torn down in 1935 when people were no longer grinding their own grain.⁷

In 1873 the Legislature created Armstrong County and on August 1, 1874 Milltown was made the

county seat (being the only settled area in the county).⁸ Although Milltown experienced steady growth including a saloon, hotel, general store, two blacksmith shops, a grain mill, drug store, a shoemaker, two doctors, two churches and a new bridge across the James River, the county seat was taken from Milltown by Acts of the Legislature in 1879. At this time Armstrong County was annexed in Hutchinson County.⁹

Hutchinson County was one of several counties which was organized by the first Legislative Assembly. It lies in the Dakota or James River Valley, the first county north of Yankton. Geographically, the county is located in the southeastern part of the state and its surface is gently rolling prairie land. The soil of the county is similar to that of all counties lying in the valley, and is a deep, dark loam.¹⁰

The United Brethren in Christ Church was first organized in South Dakota in 1878. Church records show the first progression of ministers and leaders at this time. The first bishop of the church was Milton Wright, the father of Orville and Wilbur Wright. Bishop Wright was also responsible for the startup of Huntington College in Indiana. The United Brethren in Christ Church of Milltown has been affiliated with Huntington College. The connection between the Church and the college allowed for exchange and growth for not only the local community but also nationally with other members of the same faith.¹¹

The United Brethren in Christ Church in Milltown is architecturally similar to many other small rural churches that were constructed in the late 19th century. The simple, rectangular nave-plan with little or no ornamentation was quite prevalent during this period, just shortly after homesteaders came to South Dakota to make their claim. As towns grew in size and church congregations became larger, the need for bigger churches soon evolved. In most cases these old, original community churches have not survived. For those that have, such as this historic church in Milltown, a significant part of history is still with us. The architectural integrity of the church still exists and thus the United Brethren in Christ Church is eligible under Criteria C for the National Register of Historic Places as a good example of the vernacular Gothic Revival church constructed in South Dakota during the late 19th century.

GEOGRAPHICAL DATA

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

The United Brethren Church of Milltown South Dakota is located in the west central part of the small community two blocks west of the James River that runs through the center of town. The boundary of the church is an imaginary line encompassing only the church itself. The line starts at a point 10 feet northwest of the northwest corner of the church and runs eastward to a point 10 feet northeast of the northeast corner. The line then runs south to a point 10 feet southeast of the southeast corner of the church and then westward to a point 10 feet southwest of the southwest corner of the church. The line then runs north to the original starting point.

BOUNDARY JUSTIFICATION

The boundary includes only the church. A parsonage sits on the property but it does not retain historical integrity.
