

This house is important because it is characteristic of domestic building of the 1870's when High Victorian Gothic was the prevailing fashion in architecture. The vertical proportions, irregular shape, and polychrome exterior combine to enforce an effect of calculated restlessness. Other aspects of the building which make it a paradigm of High Victorian taste are the complex roofline with its many gablets and dormers and the solidity and structural relevance of its trim which contrasts with the delicacy of earlier Gothic ornamentation.

The original owner was probably Colonel Charles A. Converse who with his wife lived in the house for many years. Colonel Converse gave the Converse Art Gallery, home of the Norwich Art School, to the Norwich Free Academy in 1906.
