A 2 1/2 story wood, Greek Revival structure with definite New England atmosphere, Old Wade House is a large, very substantial structure with a 1 1/2 story wing and a single story wing in tandem at the rear. The main building and the first rear wing have frieze windows under the cornices and the cornices are returned at the ends. The entire roof is shingled with hand-cut cedar shakes. Walls are clapboarded. The principal windows are of double-hung, six-pane sash with green, louvered shutters. The house has some twenty rooms including a number of closet-size "cells" or tiny bedrooms off the third floor ballroom where the stagecoach drivers bedded down.

Native woods of the area were used in the construction: <u>butternut</u>, walnut, white pine, oak, beech, ash and basswood. Most of the interior woodwork is of butternut, often beautifully hand-tooled. One detail that intrigued the restoration workers was the gracefully thin window sash made with hand tools. Small parts of the sash were fastened with solid wooden pegs; others had firm mortise and tenon joints as did doors and some joists. The design, detail and expert craftsmanship of the Wade House make it almost certain that Charles Robinson, son-in-law of the builder, was responsible for much of the architectural detail. Robinson helped with the construction of Wade House, and other buildings he is known to have designed and built in Greenbush confirm his hand in both the design and crafting of many of the inn's fine details of structure and trim. The Wade House was built in 1847-1851.

Alterations have occurred only in that the original wallpaper has been replaced with exact reproductions, deteriorated plaster has had to be replaced, and rotted beams or other structural members, parts of window sash, trim, and so on, had to be replaced. Whenever this was necessary, however, the replacements were of the same kind of wood as the original and were made in the same manner with hand tools. The architect for the restoration, which was done in 1950-1953, was Richard Philipp, F.A.I.A., and no detail was overlooked in maintaining fidelity. As much original material as possible was repaired and/or reinforced and reused.

Fortunately, although the Wade House had earlier been sold, the great bulk of the Wade family's original furnishings had remained stored in the ball-room. In addition, Wade House furnishings and equipment which had been taken away were assiduously tracked down, purchased or donated, and returned. As a result, few of the restored Wade House's furnishings were not there originally.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

During the middle 1800's when Wisconsin's population was growing and on the move, many stagecoach inns or taverns were built to provide meals and lodging for travelers on roads between centers of population. The Wade House, built halfway between Fond du Lac and Sheboygan by Sylvanus Wade, was "unusually large and pretentious..for its day, became a famous landmark, and is mentioned in all the accounts of early inns and stage lines in the state. Not only did it serve as a relay station for stagecoaches, but as the stopping place for emigrants, settlers and travelers of all kinds. Its rooms were filled to capacity practically every night. It is said that as many as 200 people sought shelter there at a time, but only a portion could be accommodated. A fine example of colonial architecture, and well preserved and imposing, it remains to this day a picturesque and historic feature..., attracting the attention of all who pass by."1

As mentioned in the description of the property, much of the excellence of both the design and workmanship of Wade House is attributable to Sylvanus Wade's son-in-law, Charles Robinson, who helped to build it. Around 1937, after serving as director of the Historic American Buildings Survey in Wisconsin, the late Alexander Carl Guth wrote that he wished every architect would visit Greenbush and examine the excellence of Robinson's work.

As perhaps the most famous stagecoach inn in Wisconsin's history, Wade House illustrates a phase of transportation history in depicting the best of accommodations available to the weary stagecoach traveler. Its food was of excellent quality and its rooms and beds as comfortable as could be found in the state at the time. Stagecoach drivers and passengers alike termed it "the best on the road." In addition it was at meetings held in the Wade House that plans were made for the construction of the Sheboygan and Fond du Lac Plank Road. Sylvanus Wade was one of the commissioners who had earlier laid out the route for the territorial road between Sheboygan and Fond du Lac which was completed in 1845. Before that time, Wade had already established a blacksmith shop and simple hostelry and it was undoubtedly the arrival of settlers moving inland from Sheboygan, plus the establishment of a stage and mail route, that prompted Wade to build the Wade House. Wade and his family had come to the area in 1844.

OLD WADE HOUSE

The Kohler Foundation of Kohler, Wisconsin, provided financial backing for the full and complete restoration of Wade House, which was one of the most ambitious such undertakings ever attempted in this part of the United States. The fidelity of the architectural phase of the restoration lay in the hands of master architect Richard Philipp; that of furnishing the interior completely with original Wade family items which had been used in the house during its entire period as a hostelry operated by the Wades was overseen personally by Mrs. Ruth de Young Kohler. Today Old Wade House stands as a tribute to the pioneers who cut their way through wilderness to make their homes in Wisconsin.
