

in 1880 and "still structurally sound" in 1903. The small garrison (powder house) still served as a woodhouse as late as 1880, but fell into decay and was eventually removed to Kittery Point. It has now been returned and restored on its original foundation.

The Frost house is well known for its fine stenciled interior walls. It remained in the Frost family until it was sold in 1930. It was slated for removal to nearby York Harbor at that time, but due to the depression plans were changed and removal was never effected. It is interesting to note that it is the ancesteral home of the American poet, Robert Frost, who made numerous visits to the Frost Hill area.

The present owner, Joseph Parsons, has done a goodly amount of restorative work on both the large garrison and the Frost house.

This is the only known 18th-century set of buildings in the United States erected strictly as a fortress against Indian attack by a single family.
