DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The old town of Shasta stands astride of State Highway #299. about six miles west of Redding, California. The town is at an elevation of about 1170 feet above sea level. The town site Ranged along the Highway (Main Street), on the southeast side, are the ruins of eight brick buildings and "Litsch's Brick Store" building partially restored. Along the northeast side of the highway are the ruins of "Whaley's Brewery", partially restored "Courthouse" and the "Masonic Hall" buildings. These are all of brick construction. A wood framed modern public comfort station is located near the "Courthouse". An historic old wood framed barn building has been reerected on Monument land near the "Courthouse". A modern residence and garage is located on Monument land easterly of the "Courthouse". Old and newer residences are scattered about the town site half hidden by fine old trees and shrubbery. The home of Doctor Benjamin Shurtleff, built in 1851, is a two-story frame house.

The old town of Shasta is gradually crumbling into ruins, many camps have completely disappeared. Bronze tablets have been placed commemorating activities of Early Pioneers. On the hills are cemeteries, Catholic, Protestant, Masonic and Odd Fellows, Indian and Chinese. Here are the remains of many of the first builders of Shasta. A frequent inscription on tombstones is "Killed by the Indians".

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Beginning at the intersection of U. S. Route 299 W (Main Street) with Boell Alley, thence southwesterly about 200 feet to the intersection of Boell Alley with High Street, thence northwesterly in a line with High Street about 1500 feet to a point southwesterly of the Summit of Main Street, thence northeasterly about 600 feet to a point northeasterly of the Summit of Main Street, thence southeasterly about 500 feet to Trinity Alley, thence northeasterly about 500 feet to the intersection of Trinity Alley with Second Street, thence southeasterly and southwesterly along Second Street about 900 feet and continuing southwesterly along French Alley about 300 feet to the intersection of French Alley with U. S. Route 299 W (Main Street), thence southeasterly about 200 feet to point of beginning.

Founded in 1849 as Reading's Springs and named Shasta, June 8, 1850, it was the second county seat for Shasta County, 1851-1888. It was the metropolis of Northern California during the 1850's. Here the road ended and began the Oregon Pack Trail until 1861. Present home of the Western Star Lodge No. 2 - F & A.M., whose charter was brought across the plains in the Peter Lassen Party of 1848. Today the town, reduced by fire and time to a few structures and a row of ruined buildings, bears the testimony to mining and freighting in the Trinity Alps when "gold" was the byword of the time.

State Historical Landmark No. 77.

Shasta State Historical Park today contains much of the old business district. The remaining brick buildings and stabilized ruins are representative of the period type architecture, designed to employ brick, heavy iron plate and sheet iron in the construction of "fireproof" business buildings. Classical Greco-Roman elements were freely adapted. Their vogue lasted over several decades, springing from the costly and anguishing experience of fires that devastated Shasta and many of her sister towns of the Gold Rush era.

Principal structures within the State Park project are the restored. Courthouse and Litsch Store, the Masonic Hall and the "Brick Row" ruins.
