Schellbourne is located in the foothills of the Schell Creek
Mountain range some 40 miles north of Ely. The picturesque setting includes a six foot wide, mountain-fed, year-round stream.
The site is on the edge of the Pinion-Juniper Tree belt with the
actual site growth being huge silver poplars that were planted
by the pioneers. Grass covered streets of the old town form
pleasant open areas beneath the huge trees. The site is now
the headquarters for a cattle ranch; absentee owners utilizing
the old residence of the ranch as a summer home. The old town
of Schellbourne included several stores, blacksmith shops,
livery stables, a boarding house, post office and a newspaper.
A portion of these buildings remain and are utilized by the
ranching operation. The site of Schellbourne is on a slope,
with native trees and brush in the marsh area below to the stream
Pioneer cabins remain along the stream edge.

From the site one can look down to the broad valley floor and toward the Egan range to the west and to the east into the half circle of the Schell mountains. A good hard surface road leads from U.S. Highway 93, alternate 50, three miles east to the historic site of Schellbourne and on through Schellbourne Pass into the Goshute Indian Reservation. A hard surfaced loop-back leads one south down the east side of the Schell Range 53 miles to Conners Pass, (Major's Place) and thence 28 miles back north to Ely.

The site of Schellbourne has been a Shoshone Indian village, Overland Stage and Mail stop, Pony Express Station, a location on the route of the Overland Telegraph, base of military operations, mining camp, and a location on the Lincoln Transcontinental highway. Its strategic location with shade trees, grass and water have made it a desirable, natural stopping place for travelers. It has never been entirely abandoned.

Captain James Simpson, seeking a route across the Great Basin shorter than the Humboldt River Trail, passed through the site of Schellbourne in 1859. Later that year an Overland Stage and Mail station was built there. In 1860, the Pony Express established Schell Creek Station with corral and station house. The Overland Telegraph passed over the same route in 1861.

The site briefly took the name Fort Schellbourne in 1862 after a detachment of troops camped here to head off troublesome Indians who harassed the stages and mails. Later in the decade, after the Indians were subdued, the troops were transferred elsewhere. The stage station declined after 1869 when the Central Pacific Railroad was completed further north.

Gold discoveries in the surrounding hills in 1869 led to the founding of a mining camp 2 years later. Silver ore was discovered in the mountains to the east of Schellbourne in the early 1870's and the camp became a part of the Aurum Mining District in 1871. An active mining camp developed with a population of over 500 persons. Freight brought from Toano on the Central Pacific Railroad was \$25 per ton. Timber, consisting of nut Pine, fir, cedar, and mohogany was found in abundance all over the district. The town included several stores, blacksmiths shops, livery stables, a boarding house, post office, and a newspaper, the Schellbourne Prospect.

Steptoe Valley, drained all but a few people from Schellbourne mear the close of 1872. Although its promising silver ledges had scarcely been worked, houses and machinery were hauled from

Schellbourne to the new silver strike. Late in the 1870's, the mines resumed production and the camp was lively; but by 1880 Schellbourne had declined to 50 residents.

In succeeding years, ranchers have used the stone and log buildings in this tree-studded area as their ranch headquarters, as do the present owners.
