



R. G. GAMWELL RESIDENCE ON SIXTEENTH STREET.

The home of Mr and Mrs. Gamwell, at the corner of Douglas and Sixtectuly streets is the type of the model? French Rennaisance architecture. The building is three and four stories high with a large basement under all, and the many overhanging cornices, the tower, and the many balconies are the characteristics of the style of architecture.

The paneled oak front vestibule leads to a hall where the wood carver carried out the most beautiful destina, in solld oak. The skill of the most adept is recognized throughout. The staircase is wide and leads with a beautiful curve to the second floor surmounted by a railing in which the carring follows the early style of the Corinthian designs. The staircase is supported in different places by protruding beams, all carved in figures, which likewise support the arched panels, forming a hood the width of the staircase above the beautifully titled fireplace with its bevel plate mirror and handsome case, and the cosy corner seat.

The newl at the foot of the staircase, is anique. It stands nearly four and a shelf feet high and each of the three faces is crowned by a human face telling a story of life. There are large electroliers pondant from the ceiling and projecting from the side walls, and all metal trimfings in this room are lacquered in light tones, while the hall is in dark to correspond with the dark oak.

The fireplace is really one of the most elaborate in the building, having large pier glass mirrors on either side, extending to the floor from the mantle, which is surmounted by a like mirror of ample proportions.
