Living History Farms, formerly the Martin Flynn Farm (1867-1915), now comprises 350 acres of farm land, pasture and wooded areas. A large brick farmhouse and barn are included in the property. These have remained largely in their original condition and have been well preserved. The main house, now white, was originally unpainted. The Flynn House is a two story brick building of Italian Bracketed Style. A rectangular cupola with round arched windows crowns the roof. Stone quoins, arched window hoods, a one story full front porch with wood columns, a side porch and two two story gabled projections with cornice returns and round attic windows adorn the otherwise simple square block of the main building. A small wing with side porch and roof brackets, simpler than those on the main block, appears at the rear. A nineteenth-century addition of pre-cast cement is attached to this rear The whole is supported by a foundation of brick.

The Flynn House sits atop a hill and overlooks the surrounding farmland and stream.

Also part of the original farm buildings is the gable-roofed barn. Board and batten wood construction, the barn has a cupola for ventilation, several small window openings, and one large main door.

The Flynn Farm is an example of a large unit of the post-Civil War period. The two main buildings, the Flynn Mansion and Barn, have been preserved intact largely as a result of the care given them by the State of Iowa during the years (1915-1965) when the Farm was an honor prisoner farm with plenty of labor available to maintain the buildings in good durable condition.

The Flynn Mansion is an especially fine example of the architecture of the 1870's. The Flynn Barn is a large structure built to provide shelter, grain, and hay storage, and some equipment space for the large number of horses used on the Flynn Farm which was expanded from the original 600 acres to a maximum of 1300 acres.

Martin Flynn who bought the land in 1867 and built the Mansion and the Barn was an important farm and business leader during the 1870-1906 period. Reference to his leadership as a livestock judge, cattle breeder, and business man as well as railroad contractor is contained in the article from the Annals of Iowa and the news article in Wallaces Farmer.

The 350 acres of land included in this application belongs to the Flynn Mansion and Barn. The farmland and the farmstead make an integrated unit although only 350 acres out of the original 600 are available, the 350 acres which are available include the original farmstead and an excellent cross-section of the original 600 acres.

The property is being readied for the public and will demonstrate the history of farming in Iowa. The property is also being considered for a Special Bicentennial Project as a Meeting House.


