The Sioux Falls Public Library, other than being a familiar local landmark, is an interesting blend of Greek and Romanesque architectural types. Pediments and pillasters go well with the large multiple windows and dark rough-hewn stone. It is obvious that function as well as the image of a "temple of Knowledge" was served here. To Sioux Falls, the building is unique. It is the only stone structure in the city reflecting a Greek influence. It contrasts significantly with others of quartzite construction which are either Romanesque or, truthfully, non-descript.

The stone itself is almost literally the cornerstone of the community. It came from local quarries during the latter 19th and early 20th century, a time of growth for Sioux Falls. Virtually all of the important early buildings, both public and private, used this material in their construction. The stone quarries closed around 1910 and, except for a brief period in the 1920's, the material was never again used for building. Any quartzite structure, therefore, is immediately recognized as part of the city's heritage.

The Sioux Falls Public Library has served residents for over 60 years and presents an attractive and interesting setting in the midst of less asthetic urban growth.
