Their Charter was granted by the Maryland Legislature in 1835. The Improved Order of Red Men, and Degree of Pocahontas, now operate under a Charter granted by a Special Act of Congress, approved on April 17, 1906.

The Association, however remote, of the beginnings of our Republic is, nevertheless, closely tied to this landmark building - The Red Men Wigwam, Index Tribe #68.

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
