The statue, The Recording Angel, which Lorado Taft created in 1921-1923, is an approximately twice life-size figure of a woman, depicted with the wings of an angel, seated and holding on her lap the Book of Life. "The closed eyes and relaxed serenity of expression on the face gives to the beholder a benignity, a tranquility in his pause of reflection."

Cast in bronze, the statue now has a shiny, slate-colored patina. It rests on a grey Massachusetts granite base, standing about two feet above the ground. In the background, standing on the same base, is a large rectangular block of polished grey granite, ten feet high, with carved molding surrounding the bottom and, at the top, a simple cornice subtended by a row of eggs and darts. There is no inscription anywhere on either statue or base.

Upon the death of his wife in 1921, Clarence Addison Shaler, of Waupun, Wisconsin, commissioned his good friend Lorado Taft to create this work in her memory. Taft worked on it for a month less than two years, and it was placed at the Shaler grave in October, 1923.

One of Taft's favorite quotations, which he used in every lecture he gave for a time, was from Spinoza: "I am certain that the good of this life cannot lie in the possession of those things which for one man to possess is for others to lose, but rather in those things which all may possess alike, and where each man's prosperity increases his neighbor's." Much in keeping with this spirit, Shaler informally presented The Recording Angel to the people of Waupun at the time that it was installed. Although the ownership legally remains in the Shaler family, Clarence Shaler's intention that the statue be for the public is borne out by the fact that "There is no inscription of any sort on the masterpiece and it is Mr. Shaler's plan that this is a much a gift to the whole cemetery...as to the Shaler lot alone." And his daughter, Marian Shaler Hanisch, writes, "I am sure that it was my father's wish when he commissioned the statue that it should be a source of pleasure and inspiration to many people, even though he apparently made no formal gift of it to the city."

In her brief biography of her husband, Ada Bartlett Taft includes The Recording Angel ("Shaler Memorial Angel") among his important sculptural works. It is the only Taft work that she lists in Wisconsin. The statue is of major importance to Waupun, a small city with a considerable amount of good public sculpture, and certainly of statewide significance to Wisconsin.
