Remains of the Japanese beach defenses still exist. On Gangi Point is a pillbox in good condition; an incompleted concrete gun emplacement is on Bangi Island as well as a concrete machin gun emplacement. On Gaan Point is a reinforced concrete strongpoint; and the remains of concrete and coconut log bunkers and pillboxes are scattered along the beach at Gaan Point. At Apaca Point is the ruins of a pillbox and embrasure. The invading Marines reported coming under heavy fire from a 75 mm gun on Yona Islet; no such gun position has yet been found. Also unlocated are gun positions on Neye Island and the cliffs of Orote Point.
