DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Waverly House is a three and one-half story simple rectangular brick structure with a two story ell. Five bays wide and three bays deep it has a gable roof and a limestone foundation. For the most part, all openings are of equal size and arranged symmetrically with the exception of those on the east side which are staggered. All double hung sash windows have eyebrow arches of brick and simple stone sills. The double doorway at the center is surmounted by a decorative metal hood. On the interior, walls are finished in plaster and the millwork is oak. Some original wall paper and paint remains. Rooms are arranged along a central hall and stairway. Presently, there are five rooms of nearly equal size on the first floor, four small rooms (former bedrooms) and a ballroom on the second, seven small bedrooms on the third and two in the attic. There is evidence that in a 1905 conversion of the use of the building (from hotel to chemical office) several rooms were enlarged. Also at some point a new stairway was installed from the first to the second floor, Originally, too, a porch with balcony extended across the front of the structure. In 1968 one of two original chimneys was removed, the other having been removed earlier, and the roof, which was at that time a composition shingle material, was replaced by another synthetic material. Waverly House presently serves as a display museum for the Bremer County Historical Society. and there is some sentiment in favor of restoring it to its original form. primarily through the restoration of the porch.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Waverly House is significant as a well preserved example of 19th century commercial architecture and as a building which has long been important to the community in its several adaptive uses.

It was built in 1863 and served as a stage-coach stop for about ten months. The coming of the railroad to Waverly in 1864 made its further use as a stage stop unnecessary, and it was converted into a hotel, in which capacity it served for the next twenty years. At that time it was again converted, this time into an apartment house.

In 1905 the CaPhenin Chemical purchased the building and used it for the manufacture of pills. Whe the CaPhenin Company terminated its use of the building in 1960 the city planned to raze the Waverly House and use the lot for parking space. Citizen support saved the old structure from demolition, however, and the Bremer County Historical Society has since used it for a museum.
