DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Vogt House, built in 1890, presents a compact mass to which a profusion of decorative features and shapes have been applied, characteristic of the busy facades of the Queen Anne style. The house is located on a hill in an older section of Iowa city, facing the length of brick Van Buren Street. The grounds (6 acres) are wooded, with tangles of brush; only the area immediately about the house is landscaped. Outbuildings are a carriage house to the west and a woodshed to the rear of the house.

The house is two stories, of brick laid in common bond on a rusticated stone foundation. The main block bears a high-pitched hipped roof, with a gabled and a round dormer facing south. The roofline -- and the overall mass -- are broken by a two-story gabled-roof pavilion to the east, a two-story polygonal bay with hipped roof to the west, and a one-story gabled roof addition at the rear. Five brick chimneys with corbelled caps further complicate the roofline. Stone is used in a stringcourse at the base of the second floor window arches.

Three window shapes are utilized. Most prominent is the flat arch, found on both floors of the main elevation, on the second floor of the west facade, and in the porch arch to the right of the entrance. These window heads have dressed stone panels which form keystones. A second form is the segmental arch, used on the second floor, east, and for the door and single window on the west side of the rear section. The former have brick arches rising from stone imposts. The plain rectangle is also found, with long, flat stone lintels, on the first floor east and west.

An outstanding feature is the latticework porch, across the front and around to the west. It is distinguished by a round pavilion at the southwest corner, with a ribbed, conical roof and finial. A square lattice pattern, set diagonally, fills the spandrels of the round entrance arch.

At the northeast corner of the house is a small board and batten shed, attached to the house proper. It has a low-pitched hipped roof and brackets.

The gable-roof carriage house is set on the rear slope of the hill, and is one story high in front, two at rear. It is rectangular, with a central gabled dormer above the wide, double-door entrance to the main level. It is of board and batten construction; the dormer is shingled. The woodshed is in better condition, and may be of a slightly later date than the other structures. It, too, is wood, with gable roof; horizontal boarding is used for walls. The ground slopes sharply away to the rear, revealing a shaped stone foundation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Vogt House is an extremely well-preserved example of local Queen Anne architecture. Its notable features are the semicircular dormer, use of stained glass, curved-head windows, and the latticework porch and corbelled chimneys. No less important is its setting; at the top of a hill at the end of a brick street, with outbuildings intact, and its natural environment, six acres of wooded land, preserved. This is one of the older sections of the city, the hill forming a natural boundary. Dwellings on either side and in the immediate area are of similar age and size, although in a variety of vernacular designs.
