DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The one and a half story Edgar Vernon House displays elements of Victorian architecture. This is especially true of the east facade which shows a highly irregular roof, a rectangular oriel window, a polygonal entry and variety of window sizes. The roof consists of both gable and hip sections, plus the multiside entry roof.

The other sides are for the most part devoid of ornamentation and are simple in appearance. The only unusual element on the west facade is an eyebrow window, most of the other openings are flat topped, double hung with slipsill surrounds. Some windows on the west side show signs of alteration. The house sets on a large corner lot and is isolated from other structures.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Edgar Vernon House is significant to the city of Presho because it is one of the few buildings that displays a Victorian type of construction. There are few other examples in the area; this is because Presho was not founded until 1905 which is well after the boom period of Queen Annes. Another important facet of the house is that twice it has been utilized for medical purposes.

The Edgar Vernon family came to Lyman County in 1907 from Wilmin ton, Deleware; the following year they constructed one of the finest homes in Presho. The carpenters engaged to erect the building were Emery Fry (who was in charge), David Holmes and Bill Nelson. The Vernons along with their black maid, Lizzie Carson, resided in the house until 1918 when adverse conditions caused them to return to Deleware.

During World War I there was a large flu epidemic and the house became a hospital which it remained for many years. Dr. Fred Newman was in charge and his wife acted as the head nurse. Newman came from Clarkville, Iowa and had degrees from Cornell College in Iowa, University of Iowa and Northwestern University Medical School. He practiced medicine in Presho from 1905 to 1950 when he died at age seventy-seven.

Next to occupy the dwelling was H.F. Blecker who used it as a residence. In the 1950's Miss Edith Logon had an outpatient clinic located there. The next owner was Hans Rasmassen and he still lives there.
