DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The former I.O.O.F. Hall in Blackfoot is a two-story structure, facing on the northeast side of West Bridge Street. It stands in mid-block between West Main and Broadway, its side to the alley. There is a striking contrast between the rough lava-rock structural fabric, which is left exposed on the rear wall, and the extremely refined treatment of the brick facade, which survives above the remodeled shopfronts on the ground floor in adequate condition to be mentally reconstructed. The facade would not originally have been white, for when the First National Bank was given exterior walls of light terracotta in 1914, its bright appearance was reported as a first for Blackfoot. Also, the windows of the hall have been closed over in recent years. However, the disposition and character of the original design are still discernable. Its features are a large round central window, trimmed with cut stone, in which the Oddfellows' emblem originally appeared; two tall rectangular flanking windows with stone lintels; a flat pilaster on either margin; and across the top a galvanized iron cornice in which a series of geometric and floral patterned friezes has been created by repousse.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The former Oddfellows' hall in Blackfoot is one of the most independently interesting and attractive pieces of early architecture in that city. It was built late in 1905 with the upstairs fitted as a hall, approached from steep stairs on the alley, and the lower level rented as commercial space. (Kinney and Sons' mercantile business was an early and long-term occupant.) Although the ground floor has been completely re-surfaced and the upper floor is no longer used as a hall, both the typical and the unusual features of the building are still fully visible. The contrast between the structure, which was not intended to be apparent, and decoration, which presented a public face to the street, is typical of early commercial architecture in Blackfoot as elsewhere in the West. The boldness and scale of the surface design is unusual among Blackfoot's older buildings, where more conservative dispositions of smaller and more strictly geometric decorative elements predominate. The metal cornice, finally, is remarkable among older buildings in Idaho for its state of preservation and its handsome repousse patterns. The character of these designs, some of them distinctly floral, suggests mass-production of classical decorative devices, such as acanthus and anthemion.
