DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lyon County Courthouse, built 1916-17, is situated on the public square near the central business district of Rock Rapids.

The building is of the loggia type, with elongated plan, three-stage elevations, one-bay end pavilions and centered, basement-level entrances. Dimensions are approximately 110' x 71'. The outer walls are Bedford limestone (rusticated on the basement level) lined with brick. Windows are for the most part 2/2 sash, many with multi-light transom panels, and on the two-story second stage are separated by flat pilasters. The modillion cornice has a wide frieze, decorated with blind medallions and triglyphs, below a panelled parapet.

The main elevation features a nine-bay giant loggia with freestanding, fluted columns. The bronze doors of the entrance in this facade are recessed within a slightly protruding vestibule, above which is a reclining stone lion. The side and rear elevations have slightly protruding centered frontispeices, set off at the second stage by paired pilasters. The aedicular frame of the rear entrance is similar to that of the front, but the doors are recessed within the frontispiece.

The interior features a central rotunda area, extending from basement level to the art-glass skylight of the dome. Corridors and offices are arranged around this feature. The main staircases and corridor wainscoting are of Italian marble, while the floor of the rotunda displays the county seal in a mosaic of ceramic tile. The third floor, which houses the legal and judicial functions, displays in the rotunda area four semicircular murals, set within the tympana of the arches which open off the rotunda to the corridors. These murals, intitled "Pioneer", "Immigrant", "Rock Rapids 1873", and "Modern Farm 1917" were possibly the work of artist William Peaco (Peaco's "Pioneer" and "Immigrant" murals in the Greene County Courthouse, Jefferson, are remarkably like those at Rock Rapids). The courtroom on the third floor is also of note, featuring an early jury box (with swivel chairs bolted to the floor), judge's bench and chair, and fine aedicular doorframes. With the exception of new lighting in some areas and the partitioning of one ground-floor room, the interior spaces of the courthouse are essentially untouched.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Lyon County Courthouse is an extremely well-preserved expression of Beaux Arts architecture in Iowa, and a good example of this state's courthouse design during the early decades of the 20th century. The Beaux Arts style was quite popular in Iowa in these years, as shown by the more than 15 such buildings still to be found in the state. The giant loggia is a principal feature of the Lyon County Courthouse, with the lion couchant above the main entrance presenting a visual pun. The handsome rotunda area, with its classical detail, mosaic, marble, and vernacular iconography of the murals, is of particular note, as is the well-preserved courtroom.

The architect, Joseph Schwartz, also designed the Methodist Church in Rock Rapids (N.R. June 1978)

Lyon County was organized in 1872, and the first courthouse erected in 1874. This courthouse, a 3-story frame structure with hipped roof and bracketted eaves, was later moved a few blocks, stuccoed and painted green, and is used as an apartment house. The present courthouse was begun in 1916 and was dedicated the following year.
