The principal architectural design feature of the church is an octagonal spire with louvered belfry which surmounts a square tower. The roof covering of the spire is of cedar shingles in alternating diamond and rectangular patterns.

The interior decoration of the church is relatively simple, consisting of unornamented wooden pews, carved and painted altar, pulpit, and baptismal font. A balustraded communion rail separates the altar from the nave-proper; it is elevated one step above the main floor. Located just southwest of the church is a 5 ft. by 5 ft. wood frame, clapboard sided privy. The brick church is situated in a rural farm setting.

Significance:

parishioners and the descendants of former parishioners began efforts to preserve the church. By August 12, 1973, when the congregation celebrated its centennial anniversary at the Marysville Swedesburg Lutheran Church, the building had once again become an important element in township life.
