DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Fireplace Bar building is a one story brick and stone building. It originally had a low stonework false front, with simple stonework roof cresting set above a plain stone cornice. The doorway arch has a polished granite keystone with the date "1900" inscribed. The windows also have granite keystones.

The sides and rear have been faced with stucco. Three windows have been added on the south. As late as 1949 a sign reading "J. W. Parmley—Western Lands—Edmunds County Abstract Company" was painted on the south wall. Originally the Ipswich Opera House stood adjacent to the north. It was destroyed by a fire and explosion in 1949 and subsequently removed. The Parmley building was slightly damaged at that time and some alterations resulted.

The interior has been altered to accommodate a cocktail lounge, but it retains the original stone fireplace from the time it served as the offices of J. W. Parmley, land broker and abstractor.

This vernacular building has segmental surrounds on the east (front) facade with vertically divided transoms.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The significance of the building is twofold. Historically, the building played a significant part in the development of Edmunds County and South Dakota. Built in 1900, the offices of J. W. Parmley, land developer, served as the scene of many land transactions, particularly until 1910. This excerpt from the town's history recounts that time:

The land boom which started in 1900 and lasted until 1910 was not a rushing boom, but just a good healthy interest in the sale of land. Many people came from Iowa in 1902 and the prospects of a very good crop gave settlers a keen interest in land sales.

The summer of 1909 was one of the boom periods and landseekers came flocking in on the trains. J. W. Parmley escorted 34 men with 8 teams and several autos out to see the land which was for sale. Mr. J. W. Parmley, Mr. Arnold and Mr. M. P. Beebe from the Bank of Ipswich were instrumental in bringing in many new settlers. Ten dollars per acre was considered a very good price for the land.

The land boom quieted down in 1910 and 1911 when the dry years started. 1

In addition to its importance to the development of the region, the building is significant by being associated with the figure of J. W. Parmley; a remarkable man of incredible energy, he was one of the early pioneers of 1883, acted as the town's first superintendent of schools, was elected to the state legislature in 1905 and 1907, studied law, was appointed County Judge, and introduced agricultural innovations to the region. He was a successful businessman and speculator, active in the affairs of the community.

In 1912 he organized the Yellowstone Trail Association which was responsible for the development of a trans-continental highway. He was president of the South Dakota Peace Society and one of the founders of the International Peace Garden on the North Dakota-Canadian border. In the cause of peace he traveled, wrote, and lectured. Until his death in 1940, he was an active, concerned citizen. His land office is one of the visible reminders of his contribution to the area.

It is one of the better period commercial buildings in Ipswich. Although vernacular in design, it does display the construction techniques of using rough cut prairie granite.
