## ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Two-story brick; plan adjusted to fit triangular block site. Eleven bays by seven; cut away corner bay at the intersection of the streets. Water table painted white; pilasters with terra-cotta capitals enriched with running-dog ornament frame each lower bay. Recessed door in corner entrance bay has company name and construction date inscribed below battlemented parapet. Original side entrance (now enclosed) has stone cornice with corner corbels, also enriched by the running dog ornament. Upper windows in flat arches rest on projecting stone course.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

Charles P. Dement had a printing company in Meridian before 1882, which probably makes this the city's earliest company of this type. Dement was the printer responsible for the 1882 Business Directory, which lists C. P. Dement as a book and job printer. The business was originally located at Front St. and 25th Ave. The Meridian Star, the city's only newspaper, was founded by C. P. Dement with the assistance of his son, James W. Dement.

*The Dement Printing Co. building, constructed in 1909, has been owned and operated continuously by the Dements since that time. The architectural significance of this building lies in its application of classical elements to an industrial structure. Ground-floor bays are defined by brick pilasters with terra-cotta capitals enriched with a running-dog ornament, and an original side (west) facade entrance is surmounted by a granite cornice with corner corbels and the running-dog ornament.*
