DESCRIPTION

6. Briefly describe the present physical appearance of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

A simple mid-nineteenth century venacular rendition of the Greek Revival. The facade of this wood frame church is delineated with a central pedimented entrance way, corner pilasters and boxed gable end roof. Simple pedimented six over six double hung windows are symmetrically placed on both sides of the building. A small rear addition repeats the classic form and cornice detailing. An original stone foundation is replaced by a concrete foundation.

The church retains its original setting -- a 19th century cemetary of individual family plots enclosed by elaborate Gothic style cast iron fences. Headstones date back to the mid-nineteenth century.

SIGNIFICANCE

20. Briefly state historical and/or architectural importance (include dates, events, and persons associated with the site when known):

The St. Louis Catholic Church, dating from 1854, is the oldest church in Stanislaus County, and probably one of the oldest, excluding the Missions, in California. Architecturally it is significant as a venacular Greek Revival structure, and remains as evidence of a style which dotted the towns and hillsides of Gold Rush California.
