Significance: This five-bay residence has the only pedimented entrance portico in the community.

Built in 1857 by Reverend Jesse Hartwell, president of Mt. Lebanon University from 1858 to 1859. Later it was the residence of Miss Lavinia Egan, who was a daughter of Dr. Bartholomew Egan, one of the founders of the university.


