#### DESCRIPTION:

District School #40 is located at the intersection of county highways 109 and 21 in rural Walnut Lake Township. The  $1\frac{1}{2}$  story, rectangular building was built in 1896 and has clapboard siding and a simple gable roof covered with asphalt shingles. Set off from the main portion of the building is a one-story vestibule with a shed roof. The pediments of both the main gable and the shedroof display sunburst motifs. The north wall of the vestibule has shingle trim and repeats the sunburst design. The tall, one over one double hung windows, located on the north and south sides of the main building, have stained glass transoms. All windows except one on the vestibule have been boarded to prevent vandalism. Local sources indicate that the school has always been painted pink, with the wood trim and the fourpaneled front door painted white. The only alterations to the building have been the removal of the bell tower and the chimney. In 1976 a new foundation was built immediately to the rear (east) of the school and the building was moved. Also located on the property is a wood shed flanked on either side by a privy. It too is painted pink.

#### SIGNIFICANCE:

District School #40 is significant as an example of a school building that was part of the rural school district system begun in Faribault County in the late 1850s. Better known as the "Pink Schoolhouse," it operated from 1896 to 1952, when it consolidated with the Wells Public School system. The following year it was purchased by the Walnut Lake Township for use as a township hall. The school remains a focal point in the township. In addition to providing meeting facilities, its unaltered interior werves as a model classroom for Wells elementary students who attend "rural" classes. The building, which is one of the best maintained rural schoolhouses in Faribault County, is a reminder of the important role it played in the education of rural youth. Regarded as a local landmark, its continued use and preservation is assured.
