

#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

The Dr. Charles Lenont House occupies a corner lot within the Central Business District of Virginia. It is a three story brick residence erected in the Queen Anne style. Set upon a foundation of local stone the main body of the building is of brick. A complex dormered hip roof comprises the third story. Variation in plane is provided by a polygonal corner tower, a two-story oriel which emanates from the roof of the full front porch and a three story curved bay. Stone is used to provide door and window lintels and for the three belt courses which encircle the exterior at basement, first, and second floor levels. The residence originally had a wraparound porch; however, the side section of the porch was removed in 1967 to provide for the addition of a greenhouse. The house remains in an excellent state of maintenance and continues to serve as a residence.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The house was built by Marcus Fay, the first mayor of Virginia. Dr. Charles Lenont, who founded the Lenont-Peterson Clinic and who speculated in mining properties, purchased the home from Fay and lived there until 1979. The social significance of the structure is that it is a clear example in both location and sumptuousness of the social distance and social distinctions that residential housing served to delineate in the mining communities of Minnesota's Iron Range.

The building is the best-preserved example of the Queen Anne style extant in Virginia.
