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Statement of Architectural Significance: Originally a two story building 60x220 with a one story boiler room and a radial brick chimney 110 ft high, this building was constructed as a condensery. It is cream brick over a structural steel frame. The chimney was built to stand a wind velocity of 100 miles per hour. Constructed of brick, the chimney has a 7 foot opening at the bottom and a four foot opening at the top.(D). A one story addition has been made to the west of the building, in keeping with the original structure. This addition was made in 1927 (G) and in 1963 (I)	Statement of Historical Significance: This was the first major industry to locate in Footville. The Footville Condensery was locally owned.(D) Before the village had a water works system the condensery provided hot and cold water for local events such the annual "Irish Picnic"(E). In 1919 the plant generated the first electric power for the village(F) During World War II, 70-80 carloads of milk was shipped by rail to U.S. armed forces throughout the world.(B) More recently the building was purchased by Triangle Pipe and Tube Company who employed about 50 people.
