SIGNIFICANCE: This is a nearly unaltered example of a small central hall cottage with Greek Revival trim. As the small stylish home of a practicing lawyer during the 1850's, this house exhibits the typical residence of a professional man of Eutaw of that period. It is the smallest of four 1-1 1/2 story double pile dwellings with characteristic 1-bay distyle pedimented portico.

DESCRIPTION: This is a one-and-one half story central hall cottage with gabled roof and interior chimneys. It has a distyle portico with square piers, a full entablature that continues across the front of the building, and a pilastered doorway with transom and sidelights. The center hall is 8' wide, and doors in the sides open at about the mid point of each room. The doors are four paneled and have plain, flat frames. Mantels are pilastered, and the late date for Greek Revival trim is manifested in a low, ogee arch cut into the underside of the fascia boards, a Gothic touch.
