The First National Bank is located at the intersection of 3rd and south streets in Tracy's business district. It is a two-story rectangular Romanesque structure of rusticated Sioux Quartzite quarried at Jasper Stone Company and Quarry in nearby Rock County (placed on the National Register in January, 1978). Ornamentation, although restrained, includes a second story frieze of a polychromatic checkerboard design, a continuous stone sill which runs the course of the second story, and a repetitive series of arches with a radiating voussoir pattern arc the second story windows and over two large storefront windows at the front. Windows on the second story retain original sash. Minor alterations have been made to the entrance and original plate and stained glass has been removed from first story windows. The building is currently used for residential and commercial purposes; the second story, once office space, is being converted to an apartment while the first floor houses a real estate/travel agency. Care is being taken to preserve the exterior facade.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The First National Bank at Tracy is significant for its utilization of a native southwest Minnesota building material in a well articulated Romanesque design. In 1897 the First National Bank (formerly the First State Bank) began construction of a new bank building. Local tradition indicates that the large, rough cut Sioux quartzite block, were brought to Tracy by railroad car and cut on the construction site by itinerant stone cutters. Until April, 1931, when the bank suspended operations, First National was the oldest operating bank in Lyon County, having been founded in 1891. The bank never re-opened and the building has since been used for a variety of commercial purposes. The Bank's strong Romanesque detailing, its well preserved condition, and its prime location at the intersection of Tracy's commercial district and the Chicago & North Western Railroad tracks make it an architecturally distinctive and locally significant building.
