#### DESCRIPTION:

The Daniel Pennie House is located on the east shore of Lake Leven in Leven Township, Pope County.



The house is a one-and-one-half story L-shaped structure, with a gable roof. The walls are of grout construction, utilizing fieldstone and cement, and are scored to imitate random ashlar stone. The water table and window sills are of brick. At the center of the "L" is a two-story tower with an intersecting gable roof, and gabled dormers pierce the main roof on both the east and west sides of the northern section. Windows are rectangular and segmentally arched, with two-over-two sash. (A few sash in the northern section of the building have been replaced.) The primary decorative feature of the house is a wooden dentillated belt course which circumvents the building between the first and second stories. Chimneys pierce the roof ridge at a central position on the south gable and at the north end. There are one-story porches on the west facade and adjacent to the tower area.

According to the current owner, the interior of the building has been gutted by fire twice, but the exterior, although somewhat deteriorated, has remained in stable structural condition. Repair of the masonry walls is being carried out with care to duplicate the original surface scoring.

### SIGNIFICANCE:

The Daniel Pennie House is significant for its association with one of Pope County's most prominent early settlers, and for its locally distinctive construction. Daniel Pennie was born in Scotland in the early 1830s, and immigrated to the United States about 1850, living in Connecticut, Illinois, Wisconsin, and at Waite Park in Minnesota before coming to Pope County in 1865. He homesteaded land in what was to become Section 12 of Leven Township. Pennie was one of the organizers of Pope County the following year; local tradition indicates that he carried the county records from the short-lived first county seat at Stockholm to Glenwood "in a sack". Pennie named Lake Leven and Leven Township after Loch Leven, Scotland, and held a number of local and county offices. Professionally, he practiced stone masonry. The first dwellings of the farm were of log; the present stone-and-concrete grout house replaced a large towered log house sometime during the 1870s or 1880s. Its grout construction is rare in the state and especially unique in the Pope County area, where the vast majority of houses are of frame construction.
