

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

The Schlitz Hotel is located on the southeast corner of West Third Street and Johnson in downtown Winona. The three story brick rectangular structure has detailed facades on both streets, featuring large rectangular window openings at the street level, single and paired arched openings at the second level, and single and paired rectangular openings on the third level. Arched entranceways are located at the center of the Third Street facade and at the angled corner; the corner also includes a semi-circular window bay at the second and third levels. Stone is utilized on the water table, over the entranceways, and as window trim; the remainder of the principal facades are of brick. Pilasters extending from the street to the roofline divide the facades at irregular intervals: the Third Street facade also includes a bay with a large arched window at the third level over the entrance. A cornice wraps around the building below a patterned brick parapet. The structure is painted in a polychromed scheme. Except for the removal of a corner tower and alteration of the window sash, the building retains its original exterior features.

The interior of the building houses a newly refurbished restaurant at the first level (entered through the corner doorway) and a hotel on the second and third levels (entered through the Third Street entrance).

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Schlitz Hotel was constructed by the Joseph Schlitz Brewing Company of Milwaukee in 1892. It was operated as a cafe and hotel by the Brewing Company until about 1921, and has passed through a succession of private owners since that time. Although little scholarly research has been done on the phenomena of hotel and saloon ownership by brewing companies, records of many such establishments in communities throughout Minnesota indicate that the practice was a common one. The Schlitz Hotel and Cafe was one of several 19th century medium-size buildings in downtown Winona that utilized the upper floors for lodging and the street level space for restaurant or other commercial use. The building's integrity and recent rehabilitation to continue its original uses makes it a significant example of this type of facility.

Part of Lots Number Two (2) and Three (3), in Block Number Twenty (20), in said City of Winona, more particularly described as follows:

Minnesota

Commencing at the Northwest corner of said Lot Number Two (2), thence Southerly along the Easterly line of Johnson Street 120 feet; thence Easterly along the Southerly line of said Lot Number Three (3), 46 2/3 feet; thence Northerly and parallel with Johnson Street 120 feet to the South line of Third Street; thence Westerly along the South line of Third Street 46 2/3 feet to the point of beginning, subject to a perpetual right of way over and upon a strip of land 10 feet in width in the Southerly portion of the above described premises in accordance with reservations and provisions made in former deeds.
