The library is an interesting variation on Plan Type V, in which a reading room on one side balances the bookstack on the other. At Anamosa, the center is occupied not by a rotunda, as is the case with the large libraries of this type, but by the delivery area, which is planned as a sort of "booth," with windows looking out toward the vestibule and reading room (there are also recent openings toward the stack and rear work area; whether there were originally openings in these positions is not known). This plan is based essentially on that of Richardson's small libraries, although it may not have incorporated the Beaux-Arts visual axis set perpendicular to the entrance axis, with which Richardson organized his plans. The shelves in the stack are ranged perpendicular to a center aisle and form small alcoves.
