7. Description

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Situated on the northwest corner of Minnesota and Nassau Streets in the central business district of St. Peter, the Nicollet County Bank is an exceptional example of Queen Anne Commercial architecture. It is a two story structure executed in red St. Louis brick with creme-colored Kasota limestone trim and foundation. Originally designed to provide banking and commercial space on the first floor with offices on the second, the building continues to serve a combined commercial use to the present time.

Distinguishing stylistic features which make the Nicollet County Bank noteworthy include a polygonal oriel which projects from the corner of the building immediately above the semi-circular arched principal entry. The oriel is embellished with moulded panels, classical pilasters, bracketted cornice and polygonal onion-dome roof crowned with a finial. Elsewhere on the Minnesota and Nassau Street facades are such features as low relief patterned brick panels, rusticated stone banding, carved stone pilaster bases and capitals, and a bracketted metal cornice. Brick corbells support and accentuated the parapet.

The Nicollet County Bank Building retains near total architectural design integrity, including original fenestration. It is in excellent condition. The principal alteration has been the removal of small, ball-shaped finials from the parapet.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Nicollet County Bank is significant as a well articulated Queen Anne Commercial style building which is located on a prominent corner site in the hub of downtown St. Peter, and as one of the older banking houses in Nicollet County.

The Nicollet County Bank was established in St. Peter in 1883 as Nicollet County's second bank; the first was the First National Bank established in 1871. The construction of the bank began in the summer of 1886 and was completed in January of 1887. A multi-use building, it featured not only banking facilities,... but a barber shop, grocery store and a hot and cold bath establishment for the "great unwashed."¹ Banking operations continued to 1965 when, after 78 years in this location, the facilities moved to new quarters.

Today, the building remains in commercial use. Its original design characteristics and prominent location on St. Peter's main commercial avenue significantly links the building to the vital commercial role its played in the financial development of Nicollet County. The extensive and well-preserved detailing mark the bank as the most distinctive Victorian commercial building in this county seat community.
