
STATEMENT

The First Presbyterian Church is the excellent local example of the Richardsonian Romanesque. Steep roofs and block-like form give an overwhelming feeling of weight and mass. This feeling is accentuated by the rockfaced brownstone walls whose strongly horizontal coursing is further emphasized by wide beltcourses of lighter, smoothly dressed stone. The way in which the tower, enriched with narrow, vertical panels, pendant corbel table and short spire with gablets, rises out of the mass of the church is particularly effective. This building should be counted among the most distinguished works of local architects F.G. Clausen and Parke Burrows and one of the more important examples of the style in Iowa.
