

Beginning at A outside the NE corner of the cemetery wall, thence with wall and extended to lane 300 ft, thence SW with lane to C, thence N to wall and with wall 400 ft to the beginning, containing the stone house and cemetery. There are no other buildings here. The site contains 2 acres.
