



- (ph. 7) matted window sills;
- (ph. 9) six panel ~~to~~ doors flush on one side with beaded panels; chair rail throughout; original floors and plaster; stair rises from rear between the 2 rear rooms; mantels not pilastered, shelf type; built in press in parlour; "Salice Wallau" and "Jamey? Wallau" inscribed in original plaster in parlour; some lift latches; full cellar; door way in west end to brick wing which is now gone. Water table across front only.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, thence east 105 ft to B, thence S 150 ft to C, thence along Broadus Rd W 105 ft to D, thence N 150 ft to A, containing the stone house and fenced in yard. The mill site and graveyard are now on other farms. No other old buildings remain. About 1/3 acre
