#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

Sited on a rise on the west side of the downtown commercial district of Sioux Falls, the First Congregational Church is one of the Sioux quartzite landmarks of the city. The church is rectangular in shape with cross gable roof, and the transept located almost exactly in the center of the building. Two towers of unequal height are located in the corners of the front facade, while a third tower like structure on the north side facade contains the rear entrance. The church is 2 1/2 stories in height and has an appended two-story educational wing, built in 1955, on the south side facade. This wing merely abuts the building and is located on the least public facade. Rusticated stone, an overall squat appearance and semi-circular arches form the buildings Richardsonian Romanesque features.

On the interior the narthex leads into a large auditorium-like nave. The transept is not demarcated on the interior and a raised chancel dontains the pulpit, choir, altar and pipe organ. While the narthex and balcony have the original stained glass windows, the large, three-part side windows have c. 1960s stained glass work. The rear section of the church behind the auditorium is devoted to three stories of office and classroom space.

The west entry was remodeled in 1981.

Designed in 1907 by Joseph Schwarz, the First Congregational Church is among the finest Richardsonian Romanesque buildings in the state. Significant in the areas of architecture and religion, the congregation is the third oldest congregation in the city.

Sioux Falls Construction Co.

The Methodists were the first church body to organize in the city of Sioux Falls in 1871. The next congregations to organize were the Episcopalians and Congregationalists a year later. The Reverend Ray Palmer had been sent by the American Home Missionary Society to the Dakota Territory to found a congregation. During the first seven years worshippers met in a barracks building, but in 1879 they erected their first church. This modest, brown, frame structure was referred to as "God's Barn."

In 1907 the church chose locally prominent architect, Joseph Schwarz to design a new building. Schwarz had designed several fine structures in quartzite, including the city library (listed on the NR). Although the building used the Romanesque motifs in a skillful; the auditorium style plan resulted in a somewhat boxey shape. In addition, Schwarz was not entirely successful in handling the large expanse of wall in the building and hence the building has a somewhat ungainly appearance. Nonetheless, it is a visual landmark in the city, sited, as it is, across from the quartzite Washington High School. The building has been well maintained and the integrity of the original architecture respected when alterations have been made.
