Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

The Burnell Tavern is a distinguished eighteenth-century residential building whose exterior features are largely intact. The L-shaped building is two-and-one-half stories high with a gable roof. On the north side of the ell is a one-story wing. The windows have nine-over-six double-hung sash, except for the attic windows which are six-over-six. In the center of the five bay east facade is a pedimented entrance vestibule with sidelights flanking the door. A second entrance on the south side has a transom and a simple entablature.

Joined to the one-story wing is a gable roof breeze-way which connects the house to a nineteenth-century carriage barn. This structure has a gable roof, clapboard siding and windows with six-over-six double-hung sash.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

This substantial 13-room house is the oldest structure standing in Baldwin and has been a well-known local landmark for many years. Built by Gideon Burnell in 1737, it was an early and popular stopover on the Pequawket Trail between Portland and Fryeburg on the way to central New Hampshire. Though a simple structure, its lines are clean and its proportions true as a fine example of New England colonial architecture.

Gideon Burnell was a prosperous farmer who became something of an entrepreneur in the region, eventually owning a grist and a saw mill and running the local general store.

The house remained in the Burnell family until very recently when it was occupied for a short time by a large and careless family who did considerable damage to the building. The present owner is finishing a detailed and correct restoration.
