"Limestone Side gable": This is an example of the "Limestone Side gable House." The back of the house includes a symmetrical three over three bay configuration. The nomination includes Vernacular style small windows at opposite ends at the crest of the rocf. As is the case with many of these local Guttenberg styles; an inclosed front porch is included. The times are very simple and conservative representing the nature of the German settlers. Ornamentation is almost nonexistant.
